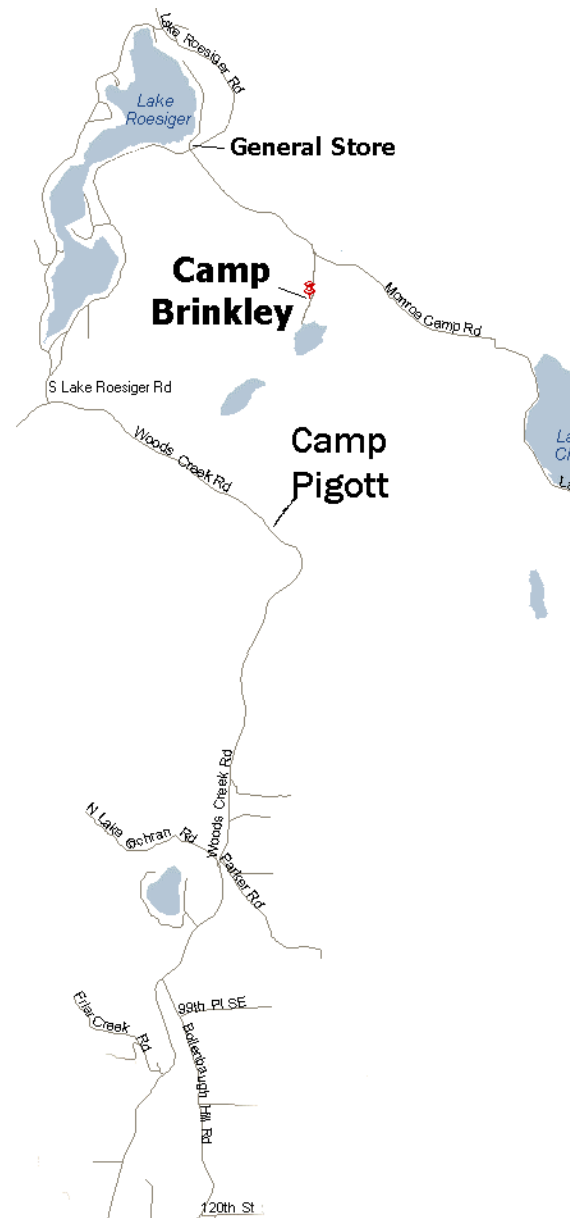

## **Directions to Camp Brinkley**

1. From Seattle take I-405 North to Hwy 522.
2. Take Hwy 522 East to its end at the stoplight where it intersects Hwy 2 in Monroe.
3. Turn LEFT onto Hwy 2 and drive approx. .75 mi. A Safeway and McDonalds will be on your left.
4. Turn LEFT onto Woods Creek Road.
5. Continue approx. 10.3 mi. Every time there is a fork in the road-KEEP RIGHT. Turn RIGHT onto S. Lake Roesiger Rd.
6. At the general store (approx 2.5 miles) turn RIGHT onto Monroe Log Camp Rd.
7. In approx. 1.5 miles, keep RIGHT at the Camp Brinkley/Cascade Scout Reservation sign and proceed to the parking lot on the right.

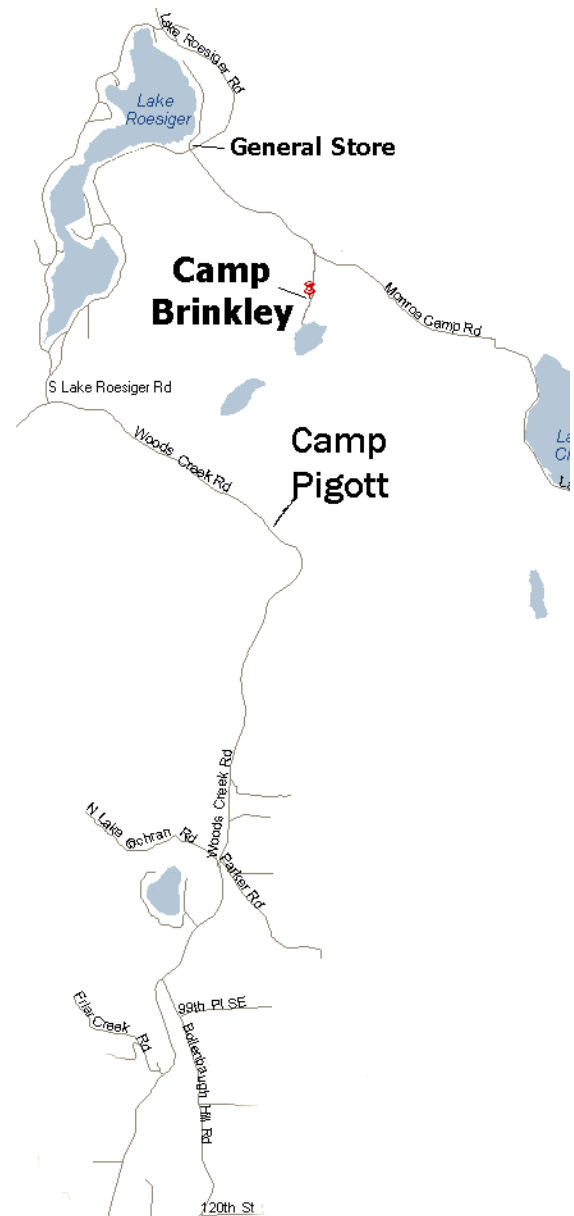

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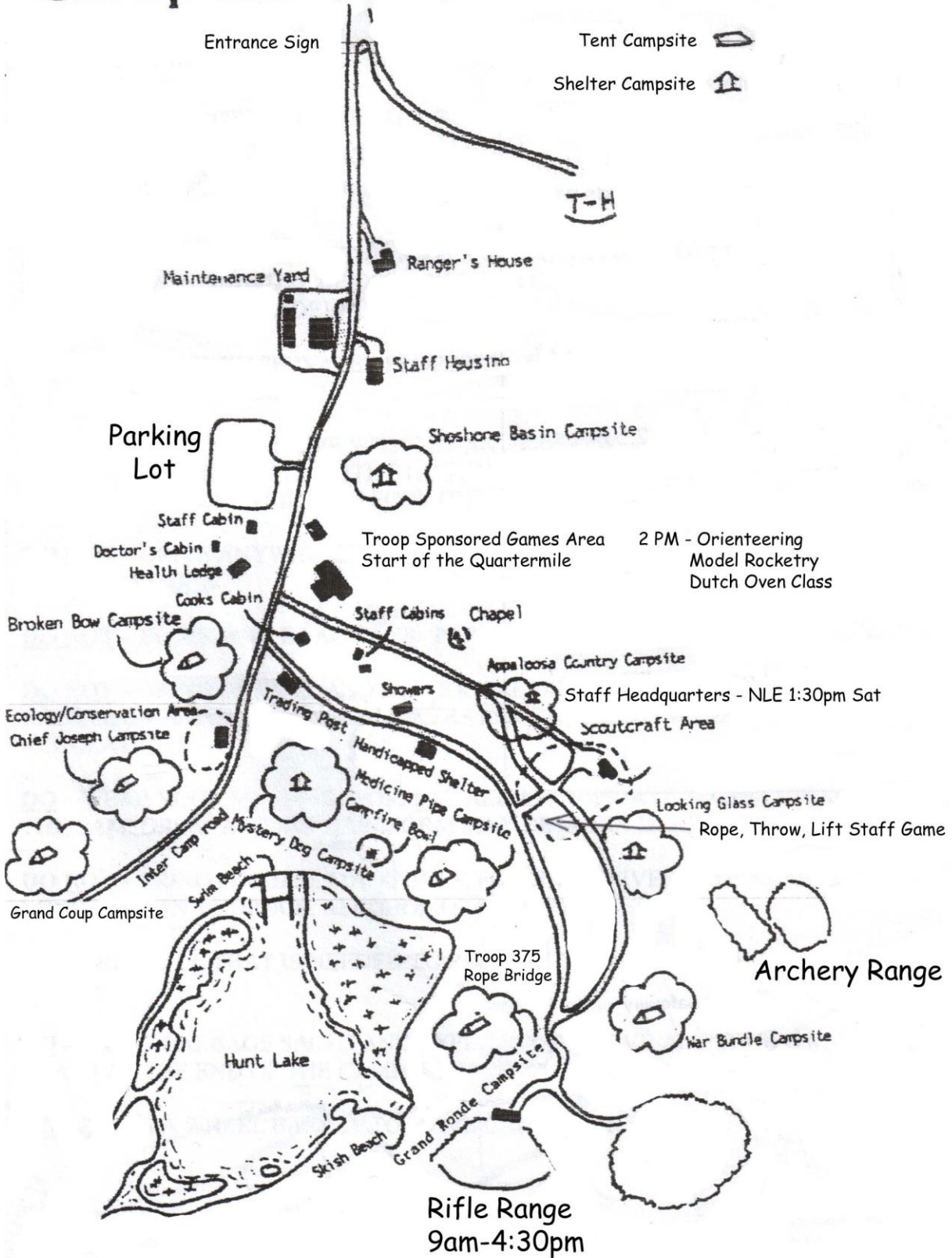

## DO's AND DON'T's FOR SPRING CAMPOREE

**DO TAKE THE TIME TO PRE-REGISTER. IT IS ESSENTIAL FOR A SUCCESSFUL EVENT.**

**DO** - BUILD ALL FIRES IN PITS. ALL FIRES MUST BE TENDED AND PROPER SAFETY PRECAUTIONS MUST BE FOLLOWED.

**DO NOT** - DIG ANY HOLES FOR ANY REASON.

**DO NOT** - WASH DISHES AT THE WATER SPICKETS OR IN THE RESTROOMS. ALL DISHWASHING MUST BE DONE IN YOUR CAMPSITE, FOLLOWING "LEAVE NO TRACE" GUIDELINES.

**DO** - DISPOSE OF WASH WATER PROPERLY. COOL IT, STRAIN IT, AND FLING IT. (LEAVE-NO-TRACE)

**DO NOT** - LEAVE THE CAMP WITHOUT AN ADULT FROM YOUR UNIT OR CHECKING OUT WITH STAFF. UNIT LEADERS ARE 100% RESPONSIBLE FOR YOUR SCOUTS.

**DO NOT** - DRIVE ANYWHERE OUTSIDE THE PARKING LOT. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

**DO NOT** - BLOCK THE ROADWAYS. PARK ONLY IN THE PARKING LOT.

**DO NOT** - BRING OR PLAY ANY ELECTRICAL DEVICES, OR ELECTRONIC GAMES, RADIOS, OR ARTIFICIAL NOISE MAKERS PER STANDARD SCOUTING REGULATIONS.

**DO** - WEAR YOUR SCOUT UNIFORM AT ALL APPROPRIATE TIMES DURING THE CAMPOREE. A SCOUT T-SHIRT MAY BE WORN DURING THE GAMES.

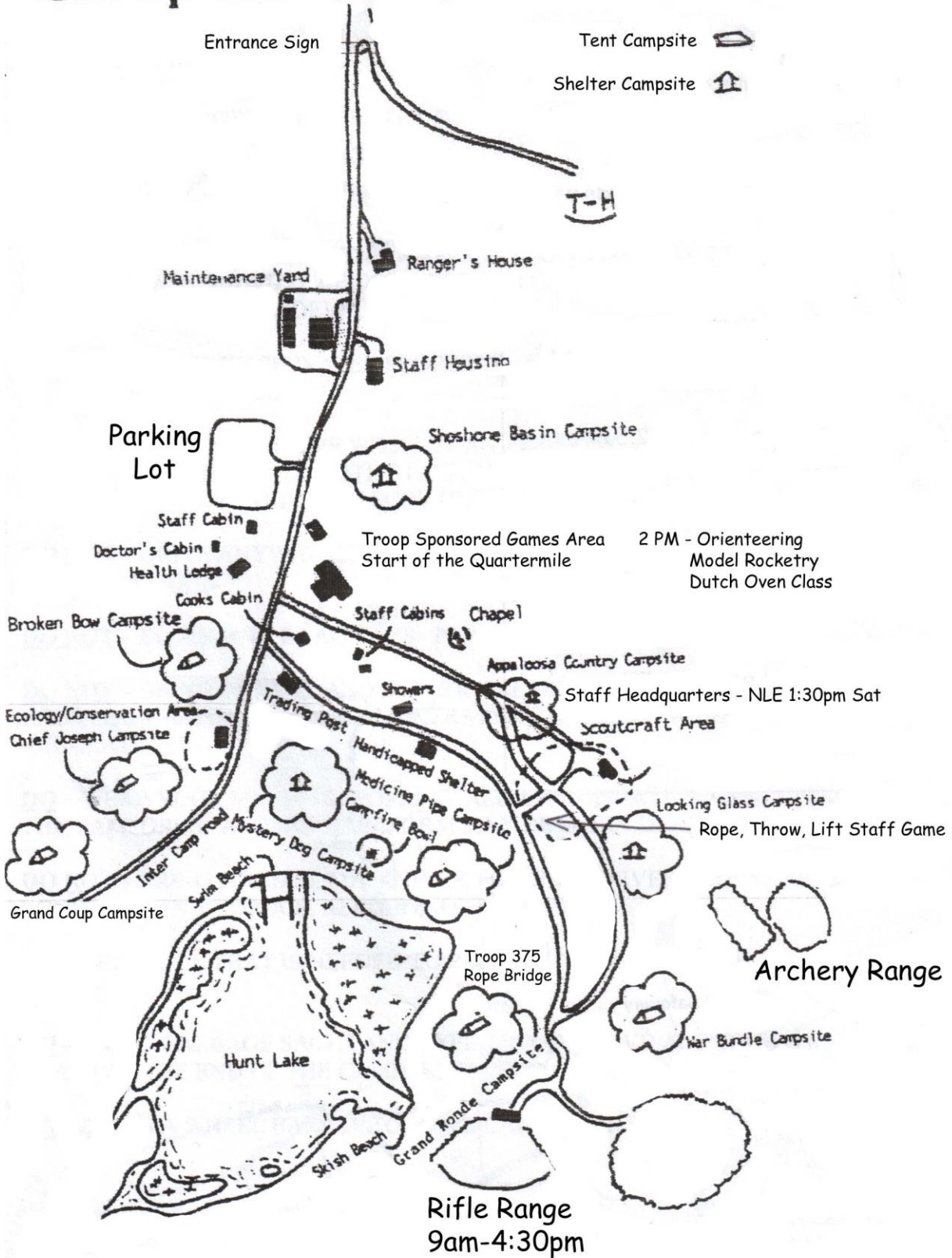
**DO NOT** - BRING FIXED BLADE KNIVES, FOLDING KNIVES WITH BLADES LONGER THAN 3", DRUGS, ALCOHOL, OR FIREARMS.

**DO** - BRING ALL THAT IS NEEDED TO RUN THE GAME YOU WISH TO SPONSOR.

**DO** - BRING GARBAGE SACKS AND EXPECT TO REMOVE ALL YOUR OWN TRASH AT THE END OF THE CAMPOREE.

**DO** - BRING A WHEELBARROW TO MOVE YOUR CAMP GEAR.

The Camporee staff would like to put out a challenge to all participants of this year's event. In fact, we would like to issue three challenges. Beyond the scout skill games provided by your unit leaders, the staff will provide three additional competitions in which you may compete. Provided here is a quick glimpse of what to expect.

- **THE DEAD-EYE RIFLE SHOOT, NO RANGE FEE 2009**

You have loved the throwing knives and tomahawks we have had in the past few years and now because we will be at Camp Brinkley, we will be able to substitute rifle shooting. How is your aim?

- **ROBIN HOOD ARCHERY.**

Do not let the Sheriff of Nottingham ruin your day; get even.

- **SATURDAY NIGHT LIVE ALL PATROL-DINNER COOK-OFF**

Two staff will judge each patrol at their campsite for style, panache, etc... Non-cash bribes may be in order. Poorly fed staff will be very bad for patrol achievement.

*HINTS: Bring props (a chandelier or candles); have patrol members serve as waiters, (dress up on class A or costumes); Set up a canopy, tables, chairs; mind your manners or etiquette, etc... Basically, be creative, unique and prepared.*

OUR STAFF ANTICIPATES AND EXPECTS YOUR SPIRITED PARTICIPATION IN THE SCOUT- SKILLS COMPETITION, EXHIBITIONS, ADVENTURE, AND, OF COURSE, THE FUN. IT IS OUR INTENT TO PROVIDE THE ATMOSPHERE AND OPPORTUNITY FOR YOUR UNIT TO THRIVE AND “HAVE A BLAST”.

Please read this entire leader’s guide. Each year many changes are always implemented. The most successful units at this year’s event will have thoroughly read and attained a complete understanding of all the sections covered in this Leader’s Guide. We hope these changes will all be for the better and will enhance your unit’s experience at Camporee.

As before, this Camporee is primarily an activity to enhance the PATROL METHOD within your unit. It is also a chance for your scouts to show off their skills at camp-making, cooking, teamwork, and cooperative skills in taking on a variety of tasks. All activities are run with the patrol method in mind. Camping may be done in the large troop areas, but each patrol (as registered) will be judged on their ability to camp and complete scout skills as a team. Each patrol should maintain an individual campsite within the larger troop area.

This year’s Camporee will be held at CAMP BRINKLEY in the area north of Monroe, WA. This site should be familiar, as we have retained the same site as last year. We will have the same conveniences as years past, running water and plenty of bathrooms. This will help with logistical issues, and will result in better site costs. Additionally, there is very good drainage and so the site conditions should be fairly good if we encounter inclement weather. Keep in mind that Camp Brinkley sits within the convergence zone, if it rains it could be a lot!

In many of your campsites there will be fire pits where you can actually have fires. As in the past, your group will be completely responsible for bringing your own wood and cleaning up your mess entirely. If your group does decide to have a fire, please understand we are in a wooded area and fires must be kept small and under control. You will also need to post a fire duty roster in your campsite. All fires must have appropriate dirt and water buckets stationed and must be tended at all times.

This Camporee may once again be an international scouting event. We are privileged to invite and expect scouts from the Girl Scouts of America, from Boy Scouts of Canada, and Boy Scouts, Explorers, Varsity Scouts, Venture Scouts, and Webelos from other districts, councils, and states. It is indeed a pleasure to remember that Scouting is a worldwide activity and that we should enjoy the participation and competition from everyone.

The staff of Camporee have again chosen to govern this event by three simple rules: the Scout Oath, the Scout Law, and the outdoor code that we have come to know as “Leave No Trace”. We will also insist and work to ensure that all participants live within the guidelines of Safe Scouting. We will insist that all participants uphold the concept of a Safe Haven experience for all participants, youth or adult. Both adult Scouters, and our Scouts share in the responsibility to ensure observance of the Scout Oath and Law. All violations shall and will be dealt with swiftly by the staff and may result in or require the removal of an individual from the Camporee. The Camporee Chairman reserves the right to exercise his authority as he sees fit, and, as always, will uphold the Scout Law.

The Camporee can only be as strong as the unit participation. As a staff we can only provide a small percentage of the activities. Your unit is urged to “sponsor” a scout skill game to be presented to all participants during the games competition. It is extremely important that each unit make every effort to sponsor and run such a game. We know this is not always possible but keep in mind that all units who do sponsor an event will be recognized. It will certainly make for greater fun if your unit does take the time to plan and implement a game. These games, which will be played on Saturday (see schedule), is exactly what your scouts have been working towards all year. Keep in

mind, your scouts are expecting games that will test their scout skills and all the various knowledge you have given them over the past year. The more activities, the stronger the Camporee, and the more fun for the patrols. But take heed. These activities should not be run by the Scoutmaster. Indeed, they will and must be run by your unit's committee members, other trained adults and the assistant scoutmasters. Your Scoutmaster's job this weekend is to provide leadership to your youth and enjoy as much free time as possible. The required equipment for all Scoutmasters is a traveling coffee mug.

Remember, the Camporee staff is predominantly youth scouts; young men and women that have put in extra time to ensure we all have fun. Each of them is required to respect each participant and therefore deserve the respect of those same participants. They will be in leadership roles the entire weekend and will benefit from your help, patience, and guidance when required. Regardless of the situations that may arise, we are doing our best and would appreciate your unit's respect and cooperation.

We will have use of the camp's water outlets and restrooms. The abuse of these facilities will not be permitted. Abuse will be defined as any misuse of the resource, any actions that cause the areas to become unsightly or unsanitary, any dishwashing or clothes washing in the restrooms, or any dishwashing at the water source. The continued running of water on the ground will not be permitted. These resources have been made available to us as a convenience and may be revoked if we abuse it. Violations of proper use will draw a warning from staff members, but any continued violations will be dealt with by the Camporee Chairman and may result in removal of individuals or entire units.

**PRE-REGISTRATION IS ESSENTIAL BY ALL UNITS:** It is important for the Camporee staff to have an accurate count of heads and units so that we can prepare sites, ribbons, prizes, etc... It is also essential so as to limit the confusion and stress of checking in on Friday night. So, this requires planning on your part. Campsite assignment will be done prior to Camporee based on your pre-registration. Our space is a bit more limited than in years past, so while we have a great, wooded setting for Camporee we have to space units carefully. There will be a section of camp set aside for non pre-registered units but as you might expect it won't be our best accommodations. See the section on Registration and Fees for more information. All printed deadlines will be enforced. Help ensure your unit of speedy arrival, registration and site placement. **AND SAVE YOUR UNIT MONEY!**

**EARLY DEPARTURE:** Although it is expected that most units will remain in camp until after the conclusion of Scout's Own services on Sunday, we understand that some units may decide to leave Saturday night after the campfire. Please let the registration staff know of your intentions for early departure, so we may better prepare for you. This should be done as soon as possible upon arrival, or better yet, upon pre-registration. Early checkout on Sunday is not available prior to Scout's Own services. Please remember that all vehicles will be confined to the parking lot, so please plan your exit accordingly.

CAMP BRINKLEY has provided us with a very good resource for this experience. However, in reviewing the limitations, we print them here as a convenience for you and your unit. Please respect them.

1. No holes will be allowed to be dug... not for the gateways, not for latrines, not for any camp gadgets.
2. If a unit does build a fire, it must be kept entirely within the provided pit. No cutting of wood or any other resource will be permitted. Each unit must bring any wood or burn-ables that they choose to burn, and all ashes and traces of the fire must be removed from the sites.
3. All dishwashing must be done in your camping area and the 3-pot, Leave-No-Trace method should always be in use. No food scraps whatsoever will be scattered on the ground with your wastewater.
4. All garbage and trash is the responsibility of each unit to collect, contain, and remove from the premises.
5. As always, no electronic games, radios, TVs, or artificial noisemakers will be permitted in camp.

**PLAN WELL, HAVE FUN, AND REMEMBER, "LEAVE-NO-TRACE" CAMPING IS THE RULE**

## **FEES:**

The cost for Camporee this year is \$10.00 per person, adult or youth. This fee is for those attending overnight, (one night or two). There will be a \$5.00 per person surcharge for those not signing up before the **APRIL 17, 2009 deadline**. **It is very essential that units register on time** so that the Camporee Staff can properly plan all the medals, site assignments, and logistics. It will also lessen by a large degree the stress and confusion associated with Friday night check-in. The pre-registration fee for those attending for just the day Saturday is \$10 per person. The fee for non pre-registered Saturday attendees will be \$15. The fee for those that are attending only for the day is \$4.00 each. Daytime participants should also furnish a completed registration form.

Fees should be paid by check, payable to Chief Seattle Council, BSA (**Account #1-6701-601-20**). Fees are not refundable. Fees are to be sent when you pre-register, **NOT AT THE GATE**. When you choose to pre-register, you make your check-in quicker, and more hassle free. Send your registration forms and fees to:

If you are late getting registered, consider driving to the scout office or faxing a copy of registration form and copy of check. Once in your site, you will then only be required to send over a member of your group to confirm total number signed in on site. This check-in is necessary for safety/evacuation requirements, head-counts, etc. Units must inform staff of its arrival immediately upon arrival on site. This will allow speedy unloading from parking areas, with direct access to campsite.

## **OTHER REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS:**

All units are required to check in with the registration staff upon arrival, even if you have pre-registered. All units participating in this Camporee will be required of the following information.

- A council validated, completed tour permit.
- An updated roster of participants (youth and adult) if changes have been made to the original registration form.
- A check for participant's fees if you have not sent a pre-registration in.
- Each unit leader is responsible for and should have in their possession the proper permission slips and medical release forms for each youth participant attending.
- Evidence of two-deep leadership, which will be strictly enforced throughout the Camporee events, and campus.
- Cub packs visiting must have one adult for every four youth, with a minimum of two adults (1-on-1 is advised).
- Units not having the above information may not be permitted to check-in. Speed of registration requires your planning in the matter.
- Rifle range participants will need a \$2 shoot fee per person, per session. This must be paid in cash at the range.

## **LIABILITY INSURANCE:**

The responsibility of insurance rests completely on the unit. Each unit is to provide secondary insurance for scouts on any outing. This insurance is typically provided during re-charter. The district does not provide accident insurance to this event.

Properly filing a tour permit with the council activates the liability of most unit coverages. This also gives your council an excellent way to track your unit activities.

Each unit leader is responsible for having in their possession; permission slips, medical releases, and medical histories of all participants from their unit.

## **WEBELOS AT CAMPOREE:**

In the past there has been much confusion over the involvement of Webelos Scouts at Camporee. All Webelos Scouts from our district are invited and encouraged to attend Camporee. Webelos Scouts are able to stay at the Camporee, overnight, for the entire weekend. It is strongly recommended that Webelos groups retain their one-on-

one leadership keeping in mind any Boy Scout leaders present may help in filling that need. The easiest way for these scouts to attend is by having their den join with a Boy Scout Troop that is attending. The den and the troop will camp together but in all other ways they will remain separate. Webelos will compete only against other Webelos in the games but will get to compete in all the same activities as the Boy Scouts. **TROOPS:** This is a great opportunity to help your recruiting efforts; taking Webelos to Camporee is a great way to peak their interest in joining your unit.

#### **MEDICAL FACILITIES:**

A staff member will be on site for minor first aid requirements. Area medical facilities will be notified of this event, in preparation by staff, in case of major incidents. Each unit leader will be responsible for safe transport of all participants including the event of a medical emergency. Each unit should have its own first aid kit. There are close, competent medical facilities in Monroe should an emergency arise.

#### **EQUIPMENT:**

Each unit is required to provide all equipment required to participate in the Camporee. That includes all tents, stoves, cooking and eating items, wheelbarrows and all materials that go into camp gadgets, the entrance gate, etc.

Camp Brinkley has an ample supply of bathrooms and "KYBOS" for human waste facilities, and potable water from the camp's water supply. Each patrol will need to bring its own water transport vessel and each patrol will be expected to keep a supply of fresh, potable water in its camp area at all times. The restrooms will be available to the participants and those facilities will be only for the purpose of relieving oneself and not for general wash-ups or for hanging out in. No dish washing will be allowed in the restrooms.

An equipment list for the patrols / dens that are overnight camping is provided as a guideline. Units should review equipment requirements with their youth. Those units participating in special events shall provide the necessary equipment called for in that event. **PLEASE NOTE:** We will be in a wooded setting this year; the large tents and shelters we've become accustomed to will not fit here. There is also a premium on tent spaces, more boys than usual may have to share tents. Please plan accordingly.

#### **LOADING AND UNLOADING EQUIPMENT, PEOPLE, AND PARKING:**

This process may be the most frustrating part of the Camporee for all the staff, youth, and adult leaders. It always is, so be prepared and be patient. Remember that the staff is made up of volunteers, youth and adult alike, and they will have complete authority in any matter in which a dispute arises. **Every year we have adults that disregard the directions and instructions of our scout staff members while they try to carry out their assigned task of directing traffic and parking. It is imperative that the directions you are given during the parking and unloading process are followed. Anyone that does not heed the direction or instruction of a youth or adult staff member may be asked to leave the Camporee without refund.**

If a vehicle is left where it is not supposed to be, and the driver has been warned, it may be subjected to towing.

Vehicle parking will be provided in an area away from camping sites. Parking rules will be strictly enforced. Unit campsites are for tent camping only. Campers and RVs will not be allowed at this Camporee.

#### **UNITS WILL ENHANCE THE LOADING AND UNLOADING OF EQUIPMENT BY FOLLOWING THESE SIMPLE RULES:**

Plan your trip and vehicle loading and unloading prior to arriving, to meet the following guidelines:

- No participant vehicles of any kind will be allowed access beyond the parking lot. This has been said before and exceptions were made but this will not be the case this year. Handicapped scouts or scouters will of course be allowed special dispensation. Please understand that the staff may have unique needs that will cause them to drive outside the parking lot; that's just how it is. Units will be expected to haul their gear from their vehicles to their campsites. We highly recommend bringing wheelbarrows to help with this process. No riding in the back of open vehicles is allowed. Re-loading vehicles will be done in the same manner.

#### **UNIFORMS:**

The complete scout uniform (unit version) will be worn at all appropriate times during the Camporee. Scouting T-shirts (class B) may be worn during scout skills games and contests but they must have a scouting theme. Complete uniforms are required for all assemblies, campfires, and Scout's own. Those individuals participating in Order of the Arrow activities during the Camporee should bring the appropriate uniform items.

## **KNIVES, DRUGS, ALCOHOL, FIREARMS**

These “ITEMS” are not required for this Camporee and should be left at home. Use of, or possession of any of these things will result in immediate dismissal from Camporee and may result in a call to law enforcement agents. Sheath knives or knives with large blades over 3” are not permitted. There are no bears to skin, no whales to remove blubber from, and these knives just create a situation that will surely result in disciplinary actions.

Larger knives that are used for food preparation should be left in the patrol cook site, properly cared for and put away. Always leave this size of a knife with the patrol cooking utensils.

Each participant should be knowledgeable in the use of knives and axes. Each scout should have in their possession a Totin’ Chip, proving proper knowledge of use of such equipment.

## **INSPECTIONS**

Unit and patrol site inspection will be conducted during the Camporee. Check sheets have been included in this packet for your review. Unit registration, arrival, conduct, along with patrol participation and campsite, are factors considered in the judging of this activity. This inspection is required for safety reasons and will be left with you to use as a training tool. There will be only one inspection, make sure you are ready (check the schedule for the time). It is expected that your entire unit will be out participating in the games. This will allow the youth staff inspectors to do their job quickly, efficiently and thoroughly. Inspections will be made on a unit basis rather than by patrol. Completed forms will be included in your exit packets. An award will be given for the best three campsites. Interiors of individual tents will not be evaluated because it is a scout’s “home away from home”. As they are open air, camp shelters will be peeked into for cleanliness but inspectors will not actually go inside. Keep them neat!

## **RESOURCE MATERIALS FOR SCOUT SKILL GAMES**

It is necessary for each unit to provide all equipment for their participants in their unit sponsored game. Wood will not be available at the camp, so if you need it for your game you will need to bring some with you. A good resource is to solicit your local grocer for a couple of fire wood bundles for each patrol. **Remember, if you intend to burn wood in the games field you will need to come up with a way to suspend the fire off the ground and remove all ashes afterward.**

## **ORDER OF THE ARROW**

The Order of the Arrow will be conducting several events during the Camporee. These activities, as with most OA events, are run by the entirely by the Tenas Chak Chak chapter at the Camporee. Questions regarding these events not answered here should be directed to your chapters' chiefs and advisors. Those attending Order of the Arrow activities should be uniformed appropriately.

## **BROTHERHOOD CEREMONIES**

There will be a brotherhood ceremony conducted on Friday evening. All Brotherhood and Vigil members are invited to attend. All OA members eligible for Brotherhood are encouraged to participate. Ordeal members are eligible for Brotherhood 10 months after their ordeal. AO dues must be current to obtain Brotherhood. The Brotherhood Ceremony fee is \$22.00, which covers sash, lodge flap, and one additional years dues paid. The time for this event has changed to 7:30 PM. All those who wish to participate should assemble and sign up at the Craft Lodge no later than 7:10 PM.

## **CHAPTER MEETING**

Our chapter will be conducting a chapter meeting during the noon recess at Camporee. These meetings are for current members of the chapters. There will be business conducted at these meetings along with fellowship. Time has been made in the schedule for lunch then a meeting, but be prepared to bring your lunch to the meeting if required. Again check with your chapter chief or advisor prior to the Camporee.

## **UNIT ELECTION CALL-OUTS**

The chapter is happy to announce that ordeal callout will take place this year at Camporee. This call-out will take place directly following the campfire Saturday night. All units will be directed to stay for a few moments so that all the newly elected may be recognized by the entire camp. Turn in election list by 1pm Saturday at the Craft Lodge

## **SCOUTMASTER DEMONSTRATION OF DUTCH OVEN SKILL**

Scoutmasters may, at their option, submit desserts or goodies made in their Dutch Oven for judging by the Camporee Staff during their Crackerbarrel and Meeting at 10:45 PM on Saturday. The ovens with the submitted delicacies may be left with Quartermaster Staff right after Campfire. The Dutch Oven Master will have a prize for the winner, and our youth staff will judge "the overall best dish" submitted. Please see the events section later for complete rules for this event.

## **DUTCH OVEN COOK OFF IS NOW THE SATURDAY NIGHT LIVE COOKING EVENT:**

Popularity for the usual Dutch Oven cooking format has waned over the past several years. As a result we are making a change. This year, each scout patrol will host two members of the Camporee staff for dinner in their camp on Saturday night. This will be a graded exercise with the top patrols earning recognition. See the "Saturday Night Cooking Event" supplement for all the specifics.

## **CAMPFIRE PROGRAM:**

Each unit is encouraged to participate in providing entertainment for the camp wide campfire. In the past, we have had several instances of bad conduct and bad taste. Campfires are for the enjoyment of all attending and should be run in observance of the Scout Oath and Law. This will be the rule again this year. All song/skit/stunt/run-on participation will be pre-screened by the staff. Any improper behavior will be promptly dealt with.

Units are encouraged to let their patrols practice prior to Camporee, a great activity for troop meetings. Lets make this the best fellowship and fun, with great skits, songs, and run-ons. For those who have not been to Camp Brinkley in the past, this year's campfire will most certainly be a treat. Brinkley's campfire bowl is a sight to behold. Beyond the beauty of the bowl itself we will have a number of prepared sections of the campfire which will surely be entertaining.

## **AWARDS:**

From your input in previous years, special emphasis has been put on the fair awarding of ribbons to participants. This year there will be less ribbons because of fewer events, so the more you participate the better your chance of receiving awards. Every unit and patrol will return home with recognition for attending the Camporee.

## **AFTERNOON EXHIBITIONS:**

In years past we have included a series of special demonstrations and exhibitions as the primary focus of our afternoon program. While we believe that these events have been enjoyed by those attending, we have decided to refocus this time into the games competition that is the true center of the Camporee.

### **GENERAL INFORMATION ON UNIT CAMPSITE AND GATEWAYS**

**Campsites at the Camp Brinkley will continue to be a bit ambiguous. We will not be marking them with lines or markers. Getting everyone into camp and settled into their sites will be a complete team effort from all involved. As it is likely that multiple units may be sharing the larger campsites, please understand that there may be some graying of the lines in where campsites begin and end. We must all work with our neighboring units. By pre-registering you will help this process tremendously. All pre-registered units will be assigned sites based on the total number of people they pre-register. The more prepared you are to pre-register early (no penalty for increasing attendance or any other last minute changes) the more informed we can make you. Regardless of prior notification, entrance to Camporee and to your campsite must begin with checking in at the registration booth! If your unit campsite is not large enough or has a problem, contact the Camporee Staff at the registration booth and ask for some assistance in finding a solution. Please do not just move to another area without consulting with the Camporee staff.**

**With our space limitations we have a specific format designed to get the most out of the space available. Our intent is for every unit to have enough space to set up patrol sites within the larger unit setting. It would be advisable for your unit to bring material to mark off your area so that it can be clearly defined and identified during unit inspections and by other participants. All such materials must be removed at event's end.**

### **GATEWAY COMPETITION**

Several years ago we introduced the gateway competition at the Camporee. Camp Brinkley gives us a unique opportunity to bring this competition back in full force. Although there may not be enough room for some of the large, elaborate designs we saw back in the fairgrounds days, there should be plenty of room to get creative. Units please feel encouraged to prepare a gateway to mark the entrance to their campsites. All gateways will be judged during the unit inspections and ribbons will be awarded based on the criteria below.

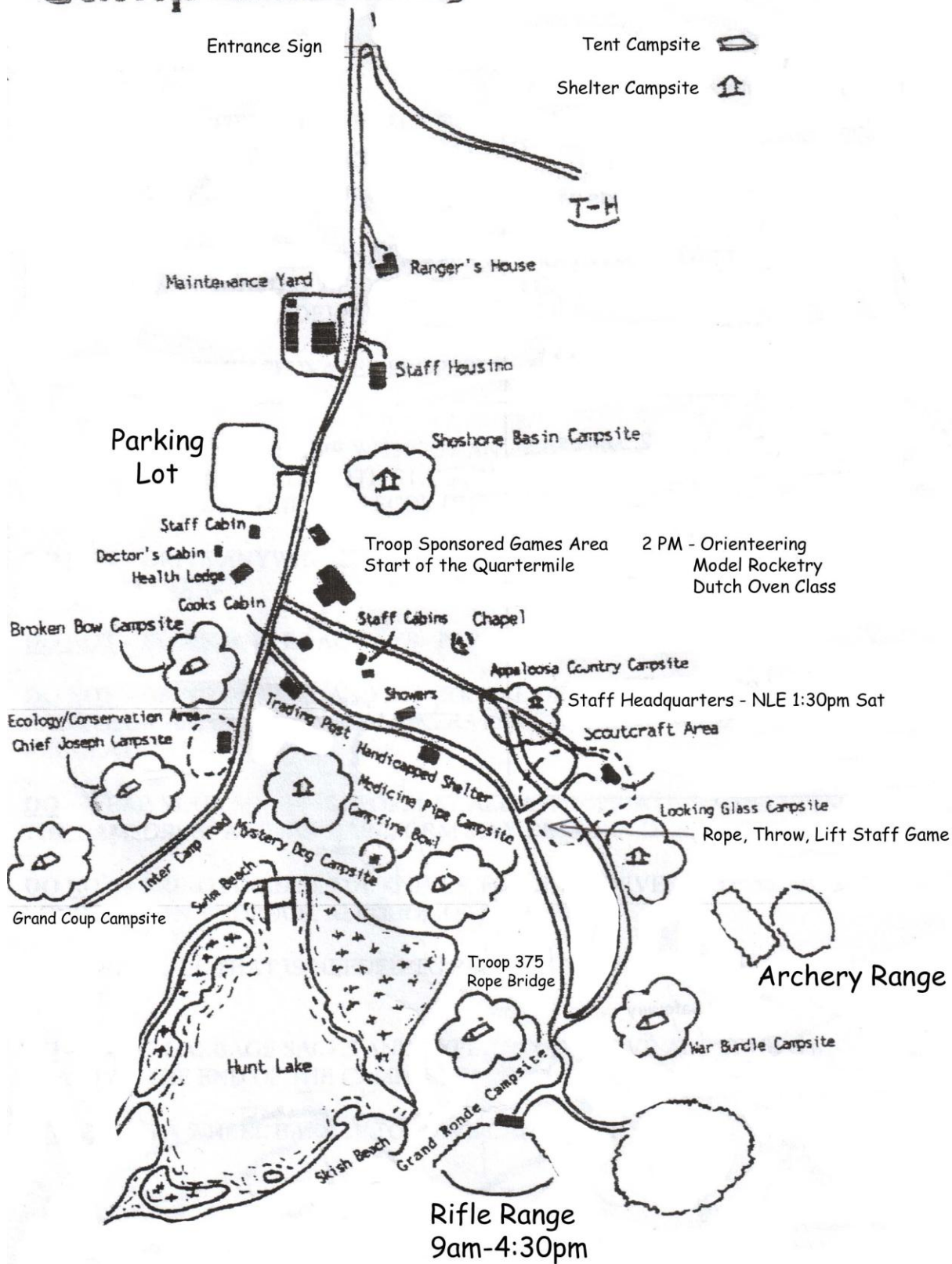
