Hello It' Klondike Derby & Snow Bash time again in Green River District!  
If you're not sure what a Klondike Derby or a Snow Bash is all about read on...

**Klondike Derby!** This is the Districts winter event that is similar to a camporee but of course is held --- yes you guessed it --- in the winter. There are two distinct parts to this year's event: the Klondike Derby and the Snow Bash.

The name Klondike originated from the gold rush era, where miners tested their skills against the elements for precious pieces of gold. Some struck it rich and, well, some not so rich. Likewise, Patrols and Dens will be awarded gold nuggets by competing against each other in a series of games based on scouting skills. New games have been added this year. At the end of the competition, the nuggets (and times) are added up and we award trophies and ribbons for 1<sup>st</sup> place (combined total score in the skill games) in three categories; Webelos, First Year Scouts and Experienced Scouts along with Patrol ribbons for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place at each skill game.

**Snow Bash!** After the Derby skill games, join us for some carnival type games and good old-fashioned fun, like Penguin bowling and pelting Frosty with snowballs! We'll have hot dogs along with some other snacks available for purchase. (Yes! We'll still be having our infamous "Mystery Soup Kettle", so don't forget to bring your two cans of soup!). What we are also adding this year is the Iditarod... Scout Style. Like the namesake, Patrols/Dens can enter to race or "mush" their sled through a course at Ensign Ranch. Teams (Patrols/Dens) can enter the race after the Derby. Start time is 12:30. There is a special award for the team that crosses the finish line in the shortest amount of time. See details in the games instruction pages below.

So, now that you troop has decided to participate, (we hope!) the following will tell you everything you need to know to get prepared, gear up, and have fun! First of all, each patrol/den needs to have a sled (see plans for sleds on the website), but don't let the idea of a sled and snow scare you off! In fact, it isn't even essential to have snow for this event – some of our best derbies have been held with minimal snow! Mud Bash...?

On the day of the derby, each patrol leader will check in at the Klondike Derby Headquarters, where they will pick up their score cards and be given instructions to the starting line, Each patrol will be given a compass heading to help them reach their first "game" skill station and off they go. No long lines at the start... hopefully!? After that they can go to any and all stations they choose. (7 stations in total this year).

A practical application of basic scouting skills will be encountered at each game station. Each patrol's "mining" success will be based on how well they follow instructions, apply their scout skills, work as a patrol in team fashion and show off their scout spirit. Their efforts will be rewarded with "gold nuggets" (see game instructions below). Teams will progress randomly through as many game stations as they have time for, up until the final deadline of 12 o'clock noon.

At noon, all scouts and adults can trek to the Snow Bash area where they can enjoy a steaming hot bowl of "Mystery Soup" (each scout needs to bring two cans of soup one will be used for this pot) or buy healthy snacks at the Derby Diner. Then everyone is invited to join in the "Snow Bash" and play some carnival-like games in the snow – just to pass the time and have some fun until scores are tallied and winners of the derby are announced. Or your patrol/den can enter the Iditarod mentioned above.

**Essential Info... That stuff the Leaders and Parents want to know...**

**WHO:** All Boy Scout Patrols, Venturers, and Webelos Dens may participate.

**WHEN:** Saturday, January 17, 2008. The Derby begins promptly at 9 a.m. (patrols can begin checking in at headquarters at 8:00 a.m.). Assemble at the "Klondike Start" Sign near the Snow Bash Area. Check the attached map below.

**CHECK IN:** Upon arrival all troops should check in with their registration form filled out (see form below) at Klondike Headquarters (summer cabins at the Field). Check in time is Friday night up until 9:30 p.m. or Saturday morning beginning at 8:00 a.m.

**COST:** \$5 per scout and scout leader if "pre-registered" prior to December 20<sup>th</sup> or \$6 per scout and leader after December 20<sup>th</sup> or on the day of the Derby. Make checks payable to Chief Seattle Council and include account number **#1-6801-722-20** on the check. Additionally, there is a \$3.50 per person day-use fee charged by Ensign Ranch, which will be collected by Ensign Ranch employees when you arrive. No day use charge if you are staying overnight at Ensign Ranch (the day use fee is included in your overnight camping fee).

**WHERE:** Ensign Ranch – located approximately 75 miles east of Seattle just off of I-90. Take exit 78 – Golf Course Road; turn left and go under I-90; turn left again on Frontage road and travel 2-1/2 miles west to the entrance. The Ranch will collect a \$3.00 day use fee when you enter the parking area.

**\*\*\*\* Please be sure to let all parents and visitors know about the day use fee! \*\*\*\***

**REGISTRATION:** To register, you can send in your registration on-line via the council website, mail a check to Carlos Avila or you can register at the roundtable in October, November or December. Remember, to qualify for the \$5 per participant fee, registration must be received by December 20<sup>th</sup>!

**ACCOMMODATIONS:** If your troop would like to stay over Friday or Saturday night, bunkhouses, cabins or tent camping is available. Call the Ensign Ranch directly for reservations and fees (509) 656-2344.

**PATROL/DEN SPECIFICATIONS:**

1. Natural patrols of 4 to 8 scouts with a suitable Klondike sled plus all essential gear (See below).
2. All scouts must be properly clothed for winter weather. (**No Cotton!** rain gear, warm coats, water proof boots etc.)
3. Each patrol must submit a roster at Klondike Headquarters upon checking in, complete with scoutmaster's signature (*roster forms are on page 5 of this Leaders Guide*).
4. The Scout Outdoor Essentials list (page 224 of the Scout Handbook) is a useful resource!
5. No flammable fluids, explosives dangerous stuff (scout meaning of "fuel" is usually considered wood not gas) Check your Scout Safety Guide in case you have any questions.

**SLED SPECIFICATIONS AND PATROL EQUIPMENT:** Sleds must be homemade. Refer to the Klondike sled plans for details. Sleds should be sturdy enough to transport one team member and all of the patrol's gear. Each patrol should bring all the items they will need to compete in each of the events of the Klondike. The Klondike is a harsh environment. Many a miner has failed to hit the mother-load for lack of proper planning and supplies. For example, be sure to bring fire building materials (there won't be any wood available in the gold fields, no flammable fluids), first aid supplies, rope, and anything else the patrol may need or want to complete each of the events (refer to game instructions below). Remember, you are going to the Klondike, so BE PREPARED!

**NUGGET POUCH:** Each team will need a sturdy homemade pouch to carry their gold nuggets in. This can be made from leather or canvas with a drawstring.

**KLONDIKE SOUP POT:** Everyone needs to bring two cans of soup to be turned in at check-in. One can goes into the soup pot, which will be available starting at 11:45 a.m. on Saturday. The 2nd can of soup will be donated to a local food bank. Each person should bring a cup or bowl and an eating utensil to enjoy a helping from the soup pot.

**DERBY DINER:** For those with heartier appetites, in addition to the free soup pot, there will be hotdogs and healthy snacks, hot drinks etc for sale at the Derby Diner.

**AWARDS:** The derby will have three award categories. Trophies and ribbons will be awarded to Webelos Scouts, First Year Scouts, and Experienced Scouts who finish first place in overall games/times scores. Patrol/Den Ribbons will be awarded for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place in each skill game. Units attending will receive participation ribbons and all scouts attending will receive a cool, 2007 Snow Bash patch! The winning patrol/den of the Iditarod race will receive a special award.

**KLONDIKE STAFF VOLUNTEERS NEEDED!!** Like last year, the games and program areas will be staffed with experienced Youth and Adults. Experienced Youth not participating in a patrol are encouraged to help staff events and program areas. Each troop attending should **plan on providing at least one adult volunteer** to assist. Volunteers should meet at the Klondike Headquarters at 8:30 a.m. on Saturday and ask how they can help.

## Games Information

---

### Starting Point

**Objective:** Patrol/Den will receive compass bearing for first skill game.

**Requirement:** Minimum of 4 scouts per Den or Patrol with a compass.

**Procedure:** After handing in the Patrol/Den roster at the Klondike office (starting at 8:00 am), Patrols/Dens will assemble at the area in front of the Klondike registration office. All Patrols and Dens will move to the starting point at 9:00 AM. The Patrol/Den Leader will receive a ticket with a compass bearing for the the location of their first station. Each Patrol/Den will then move to the NORTH POLE (located out in the center of the games field) and take their compass heading to locate their first skill game. Patrol/Dens will turn in their ticket to the judge at the first game station they arrive at. The judge will award one gold nugget for the tickets with correct compass heading. **This is not a timed event.**

**Awarding of gold nuggets:**

- 1 Nugget awarded if you arrive at the first game station using the correct compass heading.

### #1 Be Prepared Skill (timed event)

**Objective:** Patrol/Den gear and Scout Spirit check - Patrol/Den will be inspected for the proper winter equipment and outdoor essentials as well as cooperation and scout spirit.

**Requirement:** Minimum of 4 scouts per Den or Patrol + essentials gear... and Scout Spirit!

**Procedure:** Patrol/Dens will be asked to produce certain items of essential scout gear, Klondike gear and participate in scout spirit activities.

The judge will award one gold nugget for having correct gear items or showing scout spirit.

**Timed Event:** The scout spirit activity will be timed. Max. Allowed time is 3 min.

**Awarding of gold nuggets:**

- 1 Nugget for Unit Number on the sled
  - 1 Nugget for Patrol Leader Knowing names and ages of all scouts in the Den/Patrol
  - 1 Nugget for all Patrol/Den members properly clothed for this winter outing (**no Cotton**)!
  - 1 Nugget for Patrol Flag
  - 1 Nugget for Patrol Yell
  - 1 Nugget for 10 essentials
  - 1 Nugget for Nugget pouch
  - 1 Nugget for completing the Spirit game (cope)

**#2 Knot Tying (Timed Event)**

**Preparation:** The judge will provide a sack and cards with knots listed on them.  
The Patrol must Supply their own Ropes

**Requirement:** There are 8 knots that are to be tied: 1- square knot, 2- bowline, 3- clove hitch, 4- two half hitches, 5- taughtline hitch, 6- bowline on a bite, 7- timber hitch, and 8 - Figure 8 Knot. See the Boy Scout Handbook and Emergency Preparedness Merit Badge Handbook.

**Procedure:** The Scouts will be positioned in a circle with the ropes they brought as a patrol. Each scout will reach into the sack pull out a card with a knot assignment which will identify the knot that the scout will tie. The knot that is picked out of the sack is the one the scout will tie. **No trading of knots between scouts.** After everyone has his knot the patrol leader states that they are ready, the event judge will say, "start". Everyone ties their knot and puts the knot on the ground when they are finished tying the knot. Time stops when the patrol leader states they are DONE. If the patrol does not have 8 scouts, a scout may tie more than one knot. The patrol will attempt to tie all 8 knots. Note: Scouts can help each other only by talking to other scouts. (Hands off)

**Timed Event:** This is a timed event.

Time starts when the judge says "START", time stops when the patrol leader tells the judge "DONE"

**Awarding of gold nuggets:**

- 1 gold nugget awarded for each correctly tied knot.
- A total of 8 gold nuggets can be earned in this event.

**#3 Alaska Pipeline (Timed Event)**

**Preparation:** The judge will provide everything for this event.

**Objective:** To work as a team to transfer a tennis ball through sections of pipe and into a bucket at the end point. The scout with the tennis ball stands 30ft from the bucket. He cannot touch any of the pipes to help the ball along the way. The ball must go through all 7 pipes in the direction of the fuel flow. The pipes must have one bend greater than 30 degrees (approx). The idea is for the tennis ball "oil flow" to go through all 7 pipes and to be delivered to the bucket. If the ball falls out of a pipe it can be picked up only by the "ball scout" and placed back into the inflow end of the pipe it fell out of. It is up to the scouts to decide what bends and corners they will need to make with the pipeline.

**Requirement:** Minimum of 4 scouts per Den or Patrol with pipe (house gutter) handling ability.

**Procedure:** 7 sections of Pipe will be lying on the ground. The scouts designate who will be the "ball scout" and the rest will "man" the pipes as needed to transfer the ball.

**Timed Event:** Time starts when the ball is dropped into the first pipe and stops when the ball drops into the bucket at the end.

**Awarding of gold nuggets:** (Max. number of Nuggets is 8)

- 1 Nugget for each successful transfer of the ball from one pipe to the next. (6 total)
- 1 Nugget for delivering the ball into the bucket (ball must stay in and not bounce out of the bucket.)
- 1 Nugget for having at least one corner in the pipeline of at least a 30 degree angle.

**#4 1<sup>st</sup> Aid Transport (Timed Event)**

**Preparation:** Patrol/Den provides the Bandages, Splints, Poles, Blanket and a brave scout victim.

**Objective:** To work as a team to transport one “injured” scout on a stretcher from the victim area to the Medic Station (~40 yards). The scout is injured from a confrontation with a moose. This scout must be treated for his broken arm and broken leg and moved carefully as possible to the medic check point. Utmost care must be taken to ensure the injured scout does not become... more injured! Any dropping or serious jostling of the victim will result in further injury and the loss of points.

**Requirement:** Minimum of 4 scouts per Den or Patrol with strong legs and keen first Aid Skills and strong careful stretcher hauling.

**Procedure:** Scouts will line up at the medic station at the starting line with injured scout beside the Moose Trail (where he got stomped) With the “start” command from the judge the scouts will Splint the 40 yards to the injured scout and treat his broken appendages and assist him into the stretcher in a comfortable position for transport. Then the patrol carries the victim to the medic station.. After the whole patrol has crossed the finish line the scouts will set the injured scout down for the medic review (scoring). Watch out for moose on the trail!

**Timed Event:** The judge will start the clock when the Patrol leader yells “start” and the clock will stop when the Patrol safely crosses the end line and sets the injured scout down at the medic station. The injured scout must not be dropped. The Injured scout must be kept free from additional harm. Think Teamwork and Victim Safety.

**Awarding of gold nuggets:** (Max. number of Nuggets is 10)

1 Nugget for a satisfactory Arm Splint and sling

1 Nugget for a satisfactory Leg Splint.

1 Nugget for keeping the victim scout warm during transport.

4 Nuggets for the safe and successful transport the injured scout on the stretcher to the medic station.

1 Nugget will be deducted each time the victim is dropped.

2 Nugget for good patrol teamwork

**#5 Iron Chef Egg Fry (Timed Event)**

**Objective:** To work as a team to make a fire, fry an egg, and Patrol Leader eat it. The Cook (not the patrol leader) will have to flip the frying egg over to cook the top side and the Patrol/Den Leader will have to eat the egg after it has been cooked (a spatula is recommended, salt and pepper are optional). The judge will determine when the egg is cooked sufficiently to eat.

**Preparation:** The Patrol/Den must supply the wood (tinder, kindling etc.), fire starter and a clean frying pan along with a mitt or glove, which will be used to hold onto the frying pan. This mitt/glove must be able to withstand the heat of a campfire long enough for the egg to cook in the frying pan. The scouts will not be able to use their snow mitts/gloves for this game. It is also recommended that the patrol apply a little cooking oil in the pan to keep the egg from sticking as the Egg will need to be flipped and cooked on both sides. After the event, the Patrol/Den will also be responsible for putting the fire out and removing all debris after the fire is extinguished (Leave No Trace).

The judge at the game station will supply the egg.

**Procedure:** Scouts will be able to stage their materials & equipment outside of the fire ring before the judge starts the event. No stacking of wood or building the fire until the judge says, "Start". The fire must be made inside the designated fire ring area. **NO FLAMMABLE FLUIDS –NO MAGNESIUM.**  
Only Matches to ignite fire – (wax fire starters allowed).

**Timed Event:** 15 Minute Time Limit. The judge will start the clock when he yells "start" and the clock will stop when the Patrol/Den leader has eaten the fully cooked egg. During the Cooking – the cook (not the patrol leader) will flip the egg over and cook it on both sides. The judge will determine when the egg is cooked sufficiently for the patrol leader to eat the egg.

**Awarding of gold nuggets:** (Max. number of Nuggets is 8)

- 1 Nugget for bringing all necessary materials and equipment.
- 1 Nugget for successfully starting a fire.
- 2 Nugget for successfully cooking an egg.
- 1 Nugget for successfully eating the fully cooked egg.
- 1 Nugget for cleaning up the fire area.
- 2 Nugget for good Patrol Teamwork (all involved and have a job – good leadership)

**#6 Slingy Thingy (Timed Event)**

**Object:** For the Patrol/Den to work together to catch 15 tennis balls in two-minute time span.

**Preparation:** The judge will provide all equipment for this event. Items required: 5 Tennis Balls marked with a colored tape (so they can be found in the snow), tennis ball launching equipment, and 3 hand-held nets to catch tennis balls.

**Procedure:**

Each Patrol will be given 5 tennis balls to launch to their patrol in the field. One member is selected to launch the balls. Other members of the patrol are given a “catching net” and are asked to take position in the field area beyond the 30 ft marker. On the start command from the judge the scout at the launch position will begin to sling tennis balls to the members in the field. Each member of the patrol (other than the one launching the balls) must catch at least one tennis ball during the event. The method the patrol uses to have each member catch and relay balls back to the scout at the launching equipment is up to the Patrol/Den.

**Timed Event:** This is a timed event. The patrol will have 2 minutes to catch up to 15 balls. Time starts when the judge says “START”, time stops when the judge says “Stop” the patrol must stop launching tennis balls. The Patrol/Den must also pick up all remaining tennis balls and bring all equipment to judge.

**Awarding of gold nuggets:** Up to 10 gold nuggets can be earned in this event.

- 1 gold nugget for each ball caught after 6 balls caught
- 1 gold nugget for good teamwork, spirit and attitude (at judge’s discretion).

**#7 Ice Rescue (Timed Event)**

**Preparation:** Ten lengths of rope 6 feet long each. Sled and scout in the sled on the ice.

**Object:** To pull patrol member and sled off the ice to safety using joined lengths of rope.

The patrol chooses a member to sit on the sled (with all gear on sled) on the ice flow, which is 40 feet away (the member cannot leave the sled for any reason). He can reach out from his position or stand on the sledge, but he cannot touch the ground with his body or his clothes. The rest of the patrol lays rope (ten 6’ lengths) out in front of them. On the “Rescue” command, Patrol members pick up the lengths of rope and tie them together. One member throws the line to the scout on the sled who must fasten the rope to the sledge in some fashion. The patrol/den then pulls the sled and scout to safety. Time ends when the scout and sled are pulled off the “ice” (across the line). Patrols will be penalized one nugget for each patrol member who passes the “ice Rescue” line or the scout on the sled touches the ice. If the rope is thrown 3 times from a 40-foot distance unsuccessfully, the sled will then be relocated to the 25-foot distance (timing continues from the initial start time). Dens may begin at the 25-foot distance. Patrol Spirit should be demonstrated at the end with the patrol yell to celebrate the successful rescue!

**Timed Event** – 10 minute maximum Time limit.

- Time starts when Patrol Leader says they are ready and Judge says “Rescue!”
- Time ends when Sled is Pulled all the way across safety Line.

**Awarding of gold Nuggets:** Maximum of 9 Gold Nuggets (points)

- 1 Nugget for successfully tying the ten sections of rope together  
(Type of knots do not matter; Loss of rope or loss of sufficient rope to do rescue ends event.)
- Up to 5 Nuggets for a successful throw and rescue:
  - o 5 nuggets for 1st throw at 40 ft (25 ft for Webelos Dens)
  - o 4 nuggets for 2nd throw at 40 ft (25 ft for Webelos Dens)
  - o 3 nugget for 3rd throw at 40 ft (25 ft for Webelos Dens)
  - o 2 nugget for 4<sup>th</sup> throw at 25 ft
  - o 1 nugget for 5<sup>th</sup> throw at 25 ft.
- 3 Nuggets teamwork –
  - o Working together,
  - o Patrol spirit (positive attitude),
  - o patrol yell.

**#8 MAIL RUN \* NEW EVENT \***

**Preparation:** Minimum of 3 Patrol/Den members and a Sled with all gear in sled

**Object:** Patrol/Den will pull their sled through a short course (~100 yds) to deliver or pickup mail.

**Timed Team Event.-** Timed from Start to All members crossing finish Line.

One Patrol member will steer the sled from the back and remain in contact with the sled, All the rest of the patrol will pull the sled by rope and remain in contact with the pulling rope (no riders and nobody left behind). A sack of mail will be given to the sled driver to deliver to the mail station (or pick-up from the mail station.) At the Start Command the Patrol will pull the sled to the appointed mail station and pick-up the mail (or drop off the mail) at the appointed station and return to the starting point to end time. Patrol Yell at end of run to celebrate success!

**Awarding of gold Nuggets:** Maximum of 7 Gold Nuggets (points)

2 nuggets for successful Mail pick-up or delivery.

5 nuggets for good teamwork and patrol spirit.

(1 nugget loss for each member that loses contact with sled or gets left behind at any time)

- o 1 nugget All Pulling Sled together
- o 1 nugget for Driver steering & running with with sled and team
- o 1 nugget for positive attitude of patrol team
- o 1 nugget for All crossing together
- o 1 nugget for Patrol yell at successful end of run

**Iditarod (not part of the Klondike Scoring Games)**

**Preparation:** Minimum of 3 Patrol/Den members and a Sled (no gear in sled)

**Object:** Patrol will pull their sled through a **LONG** course (>500 yds) starting at the snow bash by following flag markers and ending up at the finish line back at the snow bash area.

This is strictly a race for best time. One award will be presented to the fastest sled team in each patrol division. (staff participants do not win the award even if they are first.)

Meet at the Iditarod start line near the Klondike office at 12:30 to register your sled team.

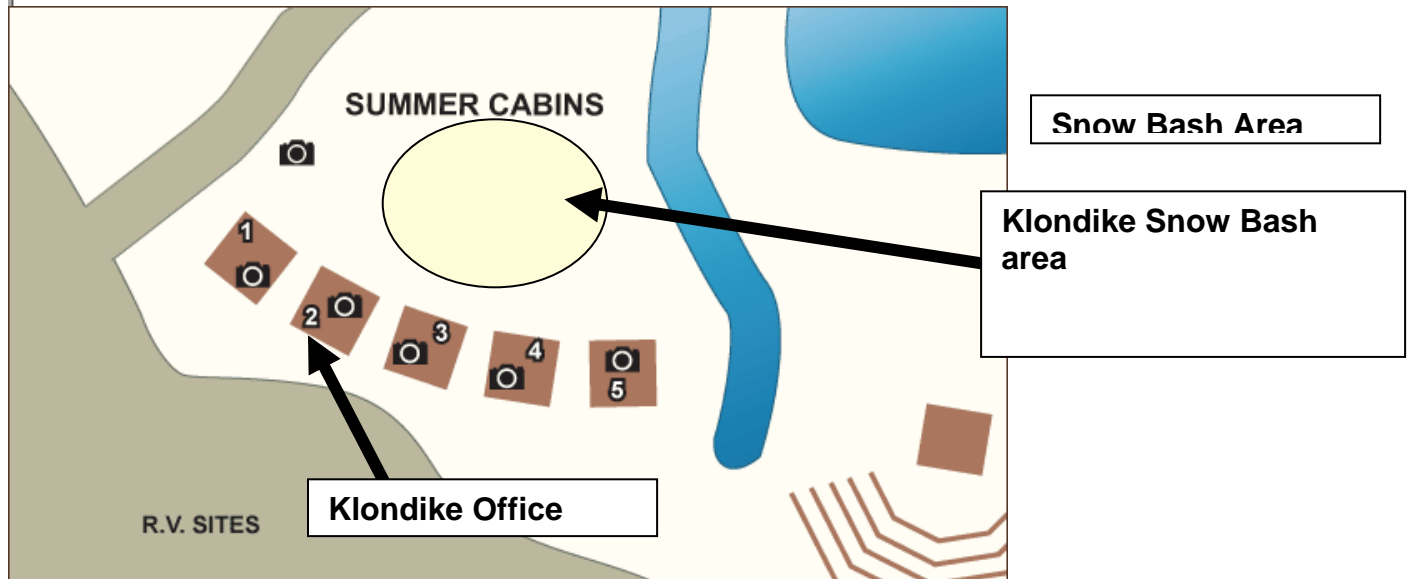
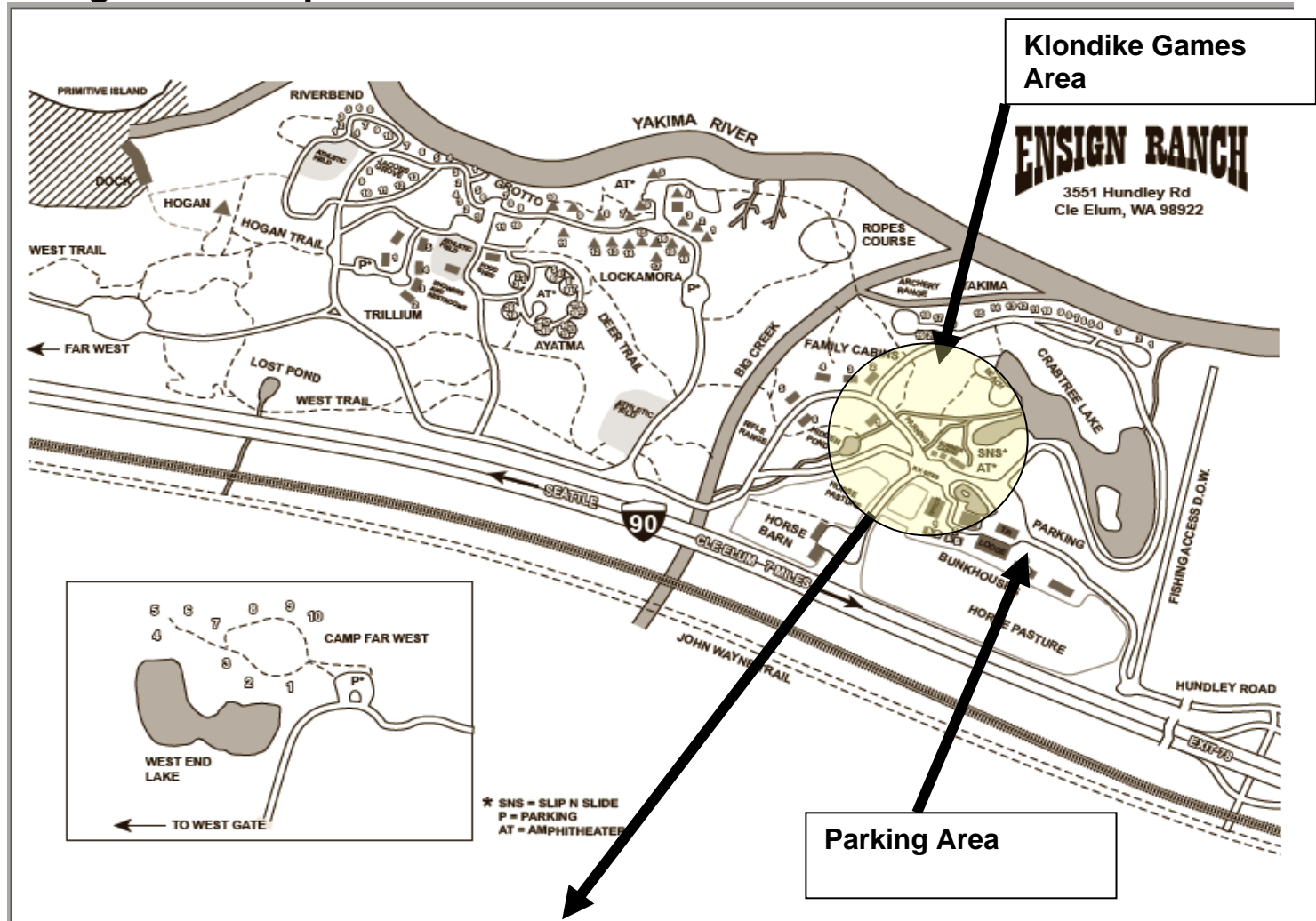
