Attention all climbers!

Scouting units planning any kind of climbing, rappelling, or bouldering activities must have an adult at least 21 years of age supervise the activity who is currently trained in *Climb on Safely*. This training can be received by contacting Clyde Ambacher, chairman of the council climbing/COPE committee. Clyde can be reached via email at cl64@juno.com. In addition, a qualified rock climbing instructor who is at least 21 years of age must supervise all BSA climbing/rappelling activities. A currently trained BSA climbing director or instructor is highly recommended. Clyde can also assist you in locating a qualified individual. The climbing instructor has successfully completed a minimum of 10 hours of instructor training for climbing/rappelling from a nationally or regionally recognized organization, a climbing school, or a college-level climbing/rappelling course.

Have a Safe Scouting Summer Safe Swim Defense/Safety Afloat

Each summer thousands of Scouts and leaders enjoy aquatic activities as part of their pack, troop, team, or crew activities. Before a BSA group may engage in aquatic activities of any kind, a minimum of one adult leader must complete Safe Swim Defense or Safety Afloat training (depending on the type of activity planned), have a commitment card with them, and agree to abide by all of the rules outlined in the training. Commissioner Convention to Replace College October 14th

In December, the college organizing committee evaluated the attendance, content, and results of past colleges with respect to three objectives: involving more volunteers directly with the council's strategic plan, increasing the number of unit commissioners, and building enthusiasm and fellowship in all commissioners. The organizing committee members - some who have been involved throughout the history of the commissioner college - decided that the college format could not address these objectives easily and decided to develop a new event. In 2006, the same committee will present an annual convention of commissioners.

The new format will provide feedback from all participating commissioners to the council, regarding what should be done to achieve its strategic plan. It will also develop the tools and solutions needed in order to adequately serve all our traditional units and build enthusiasm among commissioners.

The committee has made considerable progress in planning for the new event, which takes place on October 14. Council Commissioner Rick Cordray will serve as chair, and Dan Bodien and David Compton as vice chairs. Program and operational responsibilities are divided between eight sub committees.
