Attention all climbers!

Scouting units planning any kind of climbing, rappelling, or bouldering activities must have an adult at least 21 years of age supervise the activity who is currently trained in *Climb on Safely*. This training can be received by contacting Clyde Ambacher, chairman of the council climbing/COPE committee. Clyde can be reached via email at cl64@juno.com. In addition, a qualified rock climbing instructor who is at least 21 years of age must supervise all BSA climbing/rappelling activities. A currently trained BSA climbing director or instructor is highly recommended. Clyde can also assist you in locating a qualified individual. The climbing instructor has successfully completed a minimum of 10 hours of instructor training for climbing/rappelling from a nationally or regionally recognized organization, a climbing school, or a college-level climbing/rappelling course.

How can I register for a course? Most classes that aren't online can be registered for with an email to the cub training chair. The PTC and Woodbadge have their own forms available at Roundtable or online.

Can I take part of a training session in another district? YES. Go to seattlebsa.org and check the calendars for different districts. After the course, have them sign your training card and update your training record with your Pack at recharter time.

I'm already trained. What now? If you haven't taken Wood Badge yet, do that. It will benefit you inside and outside of scouting. Consider joining the training staff for a course and share your expertise with others. Come to the PTC and Roundtables to keep yourself energized and to pick up new ideas and skills.

Cub Scout Training Overview

A guide to leadership training opportunities for Cub Scout Leaders in the Green River District.

All the training available to a Cub Scout leader can be intimidating, which training do I take first? Which training will help me the most? Do I really have to take all that training? To help answer these questions, below is a list of Cub Scout Leader training opportunities available in Green River District and a brief description of each.

Fast Start Leader Training ---- TAKE 1ST, ON YOUR OWN

This training is available on a disc/tape from your DE or the council service center or as an online presentation (see <http://www.Scouting.org/cubscout/faststart>). New Cub Scout Leaders should watch this training within a few days of joining Cub Scouts. The training covers basic information and is designed to be an introduction to Scouting. **REQUIRED**

A leader is considered "Trained" and can then wear the "Trained" patch on his/her uniform, when in addition to New Leader Essentials and the Position Specific Training, he/she has participated in Youth Protection Training. This level of training is required for all Cub Scout Leader awards.

New Leader Essentials (Part 1 of "Basic Training"):

New Leader Essentials is an initial training for adult leaders. In this 90 min training, leaders learn about the objectives of the Scouting program and the methods that are used to achieve these objectives. They also gain a basic understanding of youth development, as well as how Scouting is organized and financed, policies related to the program, and resources to help leaders succeed. The training is for all new adult leaders of Tiger Cubs, Cub Scouts, Webelos Scouts, Boy Scouts, Varsity Scouts, Sea Scouts or Venturers. A Scout Leader needs to attend New Leader Essentials only once. **REQUIRED**

Position Specific Training (Part 2 of "Basic Training"): This training includes materials on pack organization, advancement, den and pack meeting program planning and your role within the pack. This training is about two hours long. **REQUIRED**

Youth Protection Training: This course is taught as a two hour session or it can be taken online (use the link at seattle.bsa.org). It covers how to spot such things as child abuse, how children can resist, and how to report it within the BSA organization. Youth protection training is encouraged for every adult in Scouting. To receive any tour permit, at least one adult on the outing must have this training. **REQUIRED**

BALOO (Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation): A one day course designed for all new Cub Scout Leaders and parents of Cub Scouts. This training provides the basic information adults need to successfully take a pack camping overnight. The training gives information on equipment, health and safety, first aid, campfires, locating campsites, outdoor cooking, and more. *(Note: Before a pack can go camping, at least one adult involved in the outing must have completed this course.)* Cost is \$5.

Outdoor Skills for Webelos Leaders: This course presents the "how to" of planning and conducting successful Webelos den overnight campouts. It provides a "hands-on" learning experience in camping and outdoor skills as done by Webelos dens, and gives help for teaching the outdoor related activity badges (outdoorsman, geologist, naturalist and forester). *Required for the Webelos Leader knot. Cost \$5.*

Roundtable: A monthly leaders' meeting held the second Thursday of the month. At this meeting, leaders can find information about upcoming district and council events and learn ways to improve their program. Most Roundtables will cover material based on monthly themes. Leaders can learn a new craft or get advice on how to solve a problem. Roundtables are the best source of continuing education that a leader has available.

PTC (Program Training Conference): A council training event usually held in late October or early November. Formerly known as POW WOW. It is a fun-filled day of learning specific information you can immediately bring back to use in running your den or pack programs. You register for classes in subjects that may include cooking, making crafts and neckerchief slides, wood working, ceremonies, songs, Blue and Gold Banquet planning, unit administration, and much more! It is the opportunity to choose classes according to your needs and interests. Essentials will be among the offerings. *(Note: Cost is, \$20. Being held 10/28/06 in Tukwila.)*

Wood Badge: Wood Badge is advanced training in leadership and team development, bringing together Scouters from all BSA program areas, including Cub Scouting, Boy Scouting, and Venturing. By pooling their ideas, sharing meaningful experiences, and learning from highly qualified instructors, participants will return to their home units with new skills and resources, greater confidence, and deeper dedication to deliver the values of Scouting. This training includes approximately six days of instruction that (in our council) are held as two 3 day weekend sessions, followed by time working on the goals the participant sets for him/herself. *(Note: Cost is \$205. There will be 2 courses in 2007; Spring course =5/18-20 and 6/1-3, Fall course = 8/23-25 and 9/6-8).*

Supplemental training: If it isn't Fast Start Training, Basic Training or Woodbadge, we call it supplemental. Popular supplemental trainings are Safe Swim Defense and Safety Afloat which are required to perform any swimming or boating activities with scouts and are available online at seattle.bsa.org. In addition, it is recommended to be First Aid and CPR trained.
