This training can be received by contacting Clyde Ambacher, chairman of the council climbing/COPE committee. Clyde can be reached via email at cl64@juno.com. In addition, a qualified rock climbing instructor who is at least 21 years of age must supervise all BSA climbing/rappelling activities. A currently trained BSA climbing director or instructor is highly recommended. Clyde can also assist you in locating a qualified individual. The climbing instructor has successfully completed a minimum of 10 hours of instructor training for climbing/rappelling from a nationally or regionally recognized organization, a climbing school, or a college-level climbing/rappelling course.

Merit Badge Counselor List

The Green River district maintains a list of approved and available merit badge counselors. Youth and adults who need information concerning merit badge counselors should go through their unit representative. Each unit should designate an adult to be responsible for providing merit badge counselor information. The representative could be the advancement chair or any other adult in the unit. The unit representative will obtain merit badge updates from the district representative. In extreme circumstances it may be necessary for individuals to contact the district representative directly, but the intention of the merit badge counselor policy is to obtain information through the unit representative.

Christmas Tree Recycling

Local Boy Scout troops will again serve the community by disposing of used Christmas trees. Boy Scouts from all over the Kent area will collect trees in neighborhoods, and ask for a suggested \$5.00 per tree donation. The Scouts (and adults) will take the collected trees to the City of Kent Nursery located in the southeast corner of Russell Road Park (24400 Russell Road South). A city crew will chip the trees and stockpile the chips.

This program keeps the trees out of landfills, and provides a stockpile of chips for use by Parks Maintenance to mulch new plants and maintain trails in the City parks system. By participating in this program, you can help the Boy Scouts, the Parks Department, and the environment.

The Scouts will collect trees from your neighborhood between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Saturday, January 6, 2007. If you prefer to deliver your tree yourself, please bring it to the southeast corner of Russell Road Park at 24400 Russell Road. Scouts will be on hand to unload the trees, and accept your donation. The Chief Seattle Council's role is to organize the food collection and identify community agencies that will warehouse and distribute the food to the needy at no cost. Emphasis is on food most needed for nutrition such as peanut butter, baby formula, packaged meals and canned goods, especially tuna, soups, stews, meats, fruits and vegetables.
