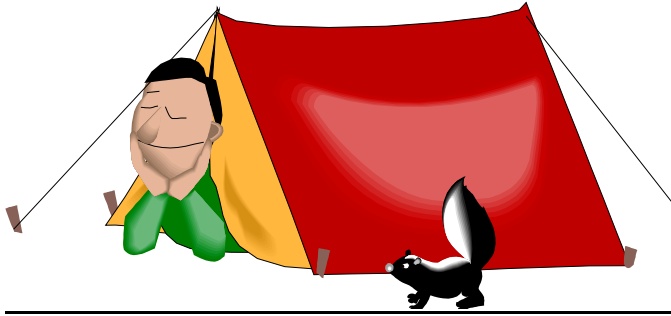

Merit Badge Counselor List

The Green River district maintains a list of approved and available merit badge counselors. Youth and adults who need information concerning merit badge counselors should go through their unit representative. Each unit should designate an adult to be responsible for providing merit badge counselor information. The representative could be the advancement chair or any other adult in the unit. The unit representative will obtain merit badge updates from the district representative. In extreme circumstances it may be necessary for individuals to contact the district representative directly, but the intention of the merit badge counselor policy is to obtain information through the unit representative.

Week two of NYLT runs from August 5 to August 11. Kevin Stock is the Senior Patrol Leader and Paul Edwards is the Scoutmaster.

Week three of NYLT runs from August 12 to August 18. Joe Farnsworth is the Senior Patrol Leader and Scott Whitmire is the Scoutmaster.

All three weeks are at Camp Sheppard. The staff development requirements for all three sessions are the same. Staff members will attend a staff orientation meeting on January 20 at the Scout Office. In February, they will be expected to attend the Trainer Development Conference on the weekend of 2/9 - 2/10 on Vashon Island. The NYLT staff development sessions will be once a month starting in March at various places, culminating with putting on the NYLT course starting July 29.

Packs, Troops, Teams, Crews and Ships can pick up their Scouting for Food door hangers at their February roundtable and distribute them on Saturday, March 10. On Saturday, March 17, the food can be picked up from the donors and taken to the designated food banks. All the details can be found at the February roundtables.

The Boy Scouts of America teaches the value of community service in all of its programs and the importance of helping others. Doing a Good Turn Daily is a cornerstone of the Scouting program. During the last 20 years, Scouts have collected more than 23 million cans of food for local community food banks.

The purpose of Scouting for Food is to; help meet the needs of the hungry; and to foster growth by enabling Scouts to experience the principle of the "Daily Good Turn."

The Chief Seattle Council's role is to organize the food collection and identify community agencies that will warehouse and distribute the food to the needy at no cost. Emphasis is on food most needed for nutrition such as peanut butter, baby formula, packaged meals and canned goods, especially tuna, soups, stews, meats, fruits and vegetables.
