Dear Scout Leaders,

I am the Education Director for a great new educational and fun opportunity for scouts coming to the Northwest on May 9, 2007. I wanted to request your advice about the best way to get this out to the scouting community. At the end of this email is a brief listing if you have a calendar. Attached is a press release and a detailed description of our scouting program.

Dig It! The Fossil Workshop Learning Center will open soon in the Everett Mall. Dig It! The Fossil Workshop is a creative, educational venue where Scouts! and < B>their families can dig for authentic fossils and minerals, prepare their specimen, and even take their specimen home. Every fossil is real and 500 to 600 million years old. Our facility will be an exciting new addition to the set of options scouts, schools and educators have for hands-on, fun learning experiences. We are now booking groups for visits.

We have specific programs geared to scouting experience and the achievement of their geology and paleontology merit badge. We can assist the scout leader in helping them teach their paleontology and geology section in their scout book. We can customize our mineral and fossil demonstration around the specific needs of their troop, helping them receive their badges or just have a great fun and educational time. The program takes about 1.5 to 2 hours. The first half of the demonstration will consist of necessary material for the scout to earn their badge. In the second half of the demonstration, each scout will receive "hands-on" fossil and mineral interaction. Each student will receive their own fossil, mineral and Paleontology/Geology certificate on completion of the demonstration.

What can Dig It! The Fossil Workshop do for the Boy Scouts of America?

1. Provide Fossil and Mineral demonstration to earn their Geology and Paleontology badge. Scouts will excavate a fossil, learn to prepare it, and get to keep the real fossil they find.
2. All scout troops are charged the special school group price of \$5 per person for one dig (regularly \$8.99 for the public).
3. Free use of our Prehistoric Party Room for troop meeting and snack time during the demonstration. A \$100 value.
4. Free use of our Prehistoric Party room for Scout Leader meetings.
5. Provide area for a display to advertise Boy Scouts, Cub Scouts, or Girl Scouts and to collect sign-ups for information from those interested.
6. Provide the use of Dig It! The Fossil Workshop to hold an annual fundraiser for your scouts. Fifty percent of all quarry proceeds will go to the scout troop.

Our over 4,300 square foot facility in the Everett Mall has 3 excavation sites, a fossil preparation area, bookstore and gift shop. We also have snacks and beverages available if you would like to have a troop meeting in our center. In the mall area adjacent to the learning center is a 1500 square foot learning and soft play area for younger children. You and your scouts' parents are welcomed to bring their younger children along to play while the scout group is experiencing the program.

Parking at the mall is quite easy and the Dig It Learning Center is located adjacent to a mall entrance that has plenty of parking for busses and other large vehicles.

Call today and we can book your group. We look forward to playing and learning with you.
