October, Fall Membership Drive 2007 is coming

Plan now to for a record-setting fall recruiting and help mold the lives of boys in your community through the values of Scouting. Whether you are new to the process or a veteran, here are some keys to a successful event:

Schedule your recruiting night on a Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday at the location where your potential new Scouts attend school. Friday nights in church basements when the target audience is a school do not typically work.

- Avoid having a pack meeting with the recruiting in September. New families will feel uncomfortable sitting through a ceremony where boys they don't yet know are receiving awards.
- Aim for 4-6 different methods of promotion. Research shows that parents need this many invites to make a commitment to attend. Fliers, stickers at lunch, door hangers in the neighborhood, yard signs and a table at the curriculum night will do the job.
- If you can make the curriculum night with a pre-approved table of information, do it!! This is a great way to interact with the decision-maker: the parents.
- At the recruiting night, be brief. No need to tell about the breakfast you made for the Scouts at summer camp or the length of the hike. Pretend you are signing your boy up for sports and provide similar information: Cost, leader, date of next meeting etc. If parents want to know specifics, they will ask you in the question and answer session.
- Have a sign-in sheet and ask everyone to sign in and fill out the youth form that night. If invited to "take the form home and complete later," nearly half will not do so and not join.

And most important of all, set a goal of how many Scouts and parents you want to recruit and don't stop until you get there. Scouting is too important and too valuable for today's youth to not keep the momentum going. Call our district executive Carlos Avila at 206-902-2330 for assistance.
