2007-2008 Green River District Awards

(Nominations are due May 8, 2008)

Unit Extra Miler Award - This award is presented by the District on behalf of the unit to an adult involved as a leader, committee member or parent, who has done a particularly outstanding job for the unit in the past year. Every unit should select up to two adults who have had a positive influence on the success of the unit

District Service Award - This award is presented by the District to Scouters who have done a particularly outstanding job serving at the District level in the past year. Scouters who have had a positive influence on the success of the District and the units in the District are recognized with this award.

Cub Scouter of the Year - This award is presented to one outstanding Cub Scouter who meets the following requirements: 1) Is a currently registered Cub Scouter, 2) Has completed two years as a registered Leader, 3) Has earned the Cub Scouter Award 4) Has participated in at least one Program & Training Conference, 5) Has attended at least 50% of the monthly Roundtables , 6) Holds regular den leader meetings or pack meetings, and 7) Wears a proper uniform to Cub Scout and district activities.

Scoutmaster of the Year - This award is presented to one outstanding Scouter who meets the following requirements: 1) Is a currently registered Scouter, 2) Has completed three years as a registered Scoutmaster, 3) Has earned the (Leadership Training Plan) Scoutmaster's Key, 4) Wears a proper uniform to all Boy Scout and district activities, 5) Allows the boys in the troop to organize and conduct troop activities, and 6) Promotes training for youth and adults in the troop.

Scouting Family of the Year - This award is presented to one outstanding family which exemplifies the notion of Scouting as a program for the entire family. The majority of the nominated family must be registered in Scouting.

District Award of Merit - This award is a Council award that is presented by the District to registered Scouters who have rendered noteworthy service to youth at the District level. The nature and value of "noteworthy service to youth" may consist of a single plan or decisions that contributed vitally to the lives of large numbers of youth, or it may have been given to a small group over an extended time.. Consideration should be given to the nominee's position and the corresponding opportunity to render outstanding service beyond the expectation of duty. This is the highest recognition that a District can give to a registered Scouter.

The Green River District's Sea Scout Ship

Sea Scout Ship 407 is preparing for some big events in 2008. We are attending the International Pacific Challenge, which is a youth longboat competition. This will be followed by the Shipyard School Raid, a 120 mile open boat race up the Sunshine Coast in British Columbia. In preparation for these big events we will be participating in the Mert Wells Sea Scout Rendezvous at Fort Flagler.

SSS407 was formed out of Crew 407 and is the only Sea Scout program in Green River District; our Ship's Crew is focused on the building and crewing of our 28 foot Umiak, a Native Alaskan style skin on frame longboat. The Umiak was hand made by the crew from 30 foot long Red Cedar timbers with Yellow Cedar ribs bent and lashed on.

The Umiak was completed last summer during the holiday break. Scouts built 12 foot sweep oars at the Center for Wooden Boats in Seattle. We will be focusing on making masts and sails through the winter. Come Spring we will be training on Lake Meridian.

Just like Venturing, SSS407 is open is to young men and women from 14 thru 20. Give us a call if you are interested in participating with our hands on, high adventure and jaunty crew.
