What made it great?

A great beginning canoe trip with the ability to go beach hiking as well. Canoe Lake Ozette on the north peninsula in Olympic National Park. Start at the north end of the lake at the Ozette ranger station. Launch canoes at the boat launch near the ranger station and paddle south to camp at Ericsons Bay which has a trail access to the beach, Allens bay camp at the south end (beach trail is overgrown but useable) or camp on Tivoli Island and paddle over to an old coast guard beach access trail halfway between Ericsons bay trail and Allens bay Trail.

Location

Lake Ozette in the Olympic National Park on the Hoko Ozette Road off of Highway 112.

Appropriate/Available time of year/season

All year access

Appropriate length of activity

Can be done for a weekend activity.

Appropriate ages & group size

All ages with BSA swimmer ability. National park group size rules apply (12 people or less). You can split the troop as we have done and camped at all three sites with extra adults.

Approximate cost per youth
