## What made it great?

A beautiful 2 mile hike along the Gray Wolf Trail is a good starter hike for younger Scouts. The overall elevation gain is nominal, but there are some small ups and downs to make it interesting.

## Location

Begin at the Gray Wolf Trailhead (N47.96710 W123.12755) near Dungeness Forks and hike to Two-Mile (N47.95443 W123.13719). There is also a smaller camp site a few hundred feet back from the camp.

---

## Appropriate/Available time of year/season

This could be done year round subject to conditions.

---

## Appropriate length of activity

This would be good for 1-2 nights. Hike should be about an hour or less, depending on the Scouts.

## Appropriate ages & group size

Best for young Scouts gaining hiking experience. The main site can hold about 10 at best, and the smaller site can hold 4-6.

## Approximate cost per youth

Currently there are no fees to park at this trailhead, but check the USFS for updated info.
