The Mohegan Council supports event registration for units and plans annual activities for Scouts, such as the Museum of Science Camp-In, where Scouts experience a private walk through of the Boston Museum of Science, learning about nature and science. Additionally, through FOS, the Mohegan Council facilitates all major district events. Some of the



Programs that the Council supports, are fully covered with Liability and Health insurance, include the following: The Klondike Derby, Fall and Spring Camporee, the annual Spookaree, all Jamborees. National Youth Leadership Training, University of Scouting, Philmont, Woodbadge, Urban Outreach and Order of the Arrow.

Urban Emphasis

The Mohegan Council Urban Emphasis Program brings the scouting experience to urban kids by providing leaders and program resources wherever the scouting tradition has not been established. The urban scouts also participate in traditional advancement programs. The program fosters participation in sports, cultural events and community service.



Council Service Center (CSC)

The Council supports and operates a fully staffed council service center where staff are always available to answer questions about membership, fundraising, camping, and other topics. Information packets are developed at the CSC along with the council newsletter and web-site so leaders are up to date with information about programs. The Scout Shop carries necessary supplies, badges, training, equipment, and support materials. The scout shop is available to unit leaders, scouts, and families to conveniently purchase books, uniforms, badges and scouting memorabilia.

Unit Serving Executives

The Council provides full-time unit serving executives, who serve as a local resource for scouting information. They recruit and train volunteers to support unit program, recruit new youth members, strengthen and maintain relationships with chartered institutions and local businesses. They also provide support to district and council activities, and manage marketing efforts to increase awareness of scouting to the general public in support of our youth. The staff is dedicated and committed to providing a program that will better serve the scouts within each unit to ensure the best possible experience and program is delivered

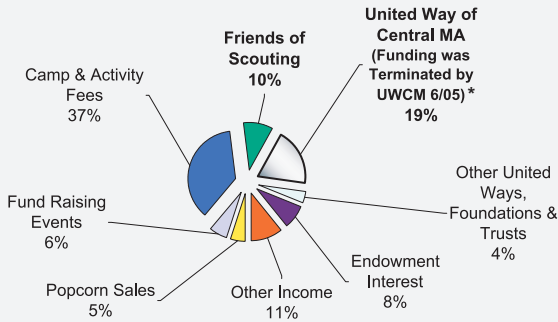

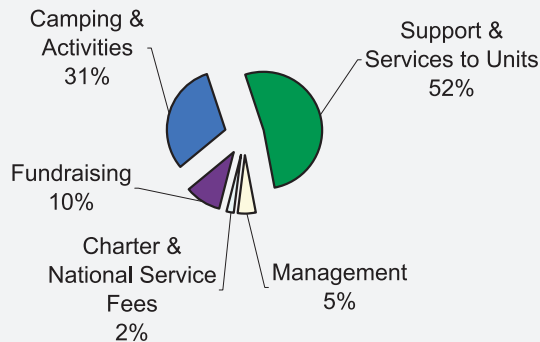

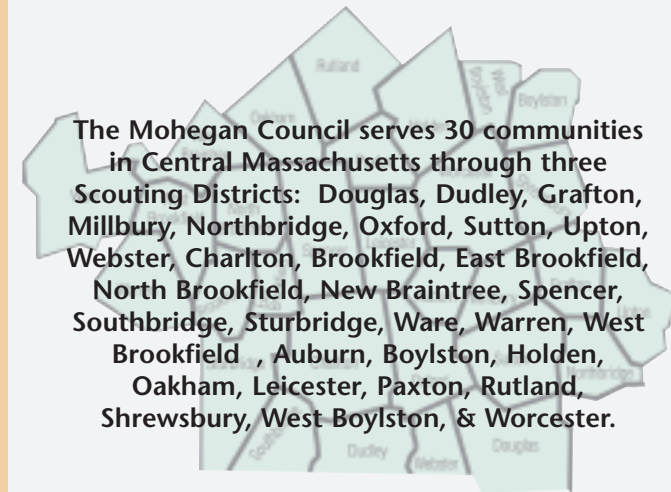
CUB SCOUT DAY CAMP

The Mohegan Council's Friends of Scouting (FOS) campaign supports the first-rate Scouting experience offered to over 4,700 families living in central Massachusetts. It is the families of the Scouts themselves who see firsthand the benefit of the Scouting program for the participating youth. District and unit volunteers conduct the FOS campaign annually as a means to ensure all Scout families have the opportunity to support the Scouting program. The annual FOS campaign raises funds to support 10% of annual operating budget of the Mohegan Council. Every year the Mohegan Council invests approximately \$170 per youth member to support his or her experience.
