What is Wood Badge?

Wood Badge is a leadership course designed for all adult Scouters. It has been designed so every adult leader for Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, Varsity Scouts, or Venturing, as well as district and council leaders and professionals, can take the Wood Badge course within two years of becoming a Scouter (though it is never too late).

Wood Badge has been the training ground for hundreds of thousands of Scouters around the world since it was established in 1919 by Robert Baden-Powell, Scouting's founder. As the challenges in the world have changed, Wood Badge has also evolved to give leaders the skills they need to strengthen Scouting units.

As a participant you will take part in many presentations, discussions, and activities that explore a wide range of leadership philosophies and tools. A key area of exploration is the process of team development. By recognizing the stages through which developing teams must pass, you will learn to apply appropriate leadership strategies that enable teams to reach their highest level of performance.

The Ticket

There are two parts to Wood Badge training. The first is the course itself and the second is the ticket. While on course, you will choose a set of personal goals relating to your Scouting position. This is your ticket. Accomplishing these goals allows you to apply and practice the skills learned on course. After you have completed the course and your ticket, you will be awarded your Wood Badge - your beads.

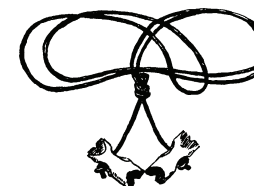

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Who May Attend

You may attend Wood Badge if:

- You are currently registered as in the Boy Scouts of America (Cub Scouting, Boy Scouting, Varsity, Venturing, district, or council) and are at least 18 years old.
- You have completed Basic Training for your registered Scouting position, including any outdoor skills training required.
- You have registered online or submitted the attached application along with the deposit.
- You have a BSA “Annual Health and Medical form.” See the website for a copy of this form if you do not have one.

You may attend again if you participated in a Wood Badge course before 2001.

Cost: \$225

Payment: A deposit of at least \$75 must accompany your application. The remainder of the fee (\$150) is due **2 months before course starts**. A few partial camper-ships (financial help) may be available.

Refunds: All deposits are non-refundable, unless the council cannot place you in the course chosen. The remainder of the fees *may* be refundable as stated in council’s camping refund policy and requests **must** be made to council in writing.
